

Kunst ist Kapital

Modern art may be in the doldrums, but there seem to be some takers of anti-capitalism art. British

artist and Marxist Merlin
Carpenter chose Simon Lee
Gallery in the heart of
hedge fund land in Mayfair
to show his pieces where
words in black paint such
as "Banks are Bad" (below)
and "Kunst (art) = Kapital"
are splattered on to white
canvases.

Mr Carpenter - who also joined the G20 demonstrators - says he is questioning the value of art and how a painting is priced. Some of his works, priced at £20,000 apiece, were created at the launch party last week. The gallery says that a couple of pieces have sold with several more on reserve. In an ironic twist, after the launch event, the gallery was attacked by several young anti-capitalism graffiti artists and the police had to be called in.
